

Fulfilled Prophecies

In the Bible, God clearly displays his ability to foretell the future with 100% accuracy. This remains an important testimony of his unique power, setting himself apart from all other beings. Isaiah boldly challenges the idols of his day: *“Present your case,” says the LORD. “Set forth your arguments,” says Jacob’s King. “Bring in your idols to tell us what is going to happen. Tell us what the former things were, so that we may consider them and know their final outcome. Or declare to us the things to come, tell us what the future holds, so we may know that you are gods. Do something, whether good or bad, so that we will be dismayed and filled with fear.”* (Isaiah 41:21-23)

Perhaps the clearest example of God’s power to foretell the future accurately is seen in the writings concerning our Lord Jesus Christ. In the Old Testament (which had been written in its entirety by about 400 B.C. and was then translated from Hebrew into Greek in 250 B.C.), many things are said about an “anointed one” who was to come. All of these prophecies were accurately fulfilled in the life of Jesus of Nazareth hundreds of years later. The mathematical possibility of this having happened on a merely chance basis is so minute that a publishing company in Denver has been ready to give a \$1,000 reward to anyone who is able to find someone, other than Jesus of Nazareth, who can fulfill only **half** of those prophecies.

Below some of the more well-known prophecies of the Messiah to come are listed, with their Old Testament reference and their New Testament fulfillment. According to the Scripture, Jesus Christ was to be:
