- Gen. 15:15** You, however, will go to your fathers in **peace** and be buried at a good old age.
- Gen. 26:29** that you will do us no harm, just as we did not molest you but always treated you well and sent you away in **peace**. And now you are blessed by the LORD.”
- Gen. 26:31** Early the next morning the men swore an oath to each other. Then Isaac sent them on their way, and they left him in **peace**.
- Gen. 44:17** But Joseph said, “Far be it from me to do such a thing! Only the man who was found to have the cup will become my slave. The rest of you, go back to your father in **peace**.”
- Lev. 26:6** “I will grant **peace** in the land, and you will lie down and no one will make you afraid. I will remove savage beasts from the land, and the sword will not pass through your country.
- Num. 6:26** the LORD turn his face toward you and give you **peace**.” ’
- Num. 25:12** Therefore tell him I am making my covenant of **peace** with him.
- Dt. 2:26** From the desert of Kedemoth I sent messengers to Sihon king of Heshbon offering **peace** and saying,
- Dt. 20:10** When you march up to attack a city, make its people an offer of **peace**.
- Dt. 20:12** If they refuse to make **peace** and they engage you in battle, lay siege to that city.
- Jsh. 9:15** Then Joshua made a treaty of **peace** with them to let them live, and the leaders of the assembly ratified it by oath.
- Jsh. 10:1** Now Adoni-Zedek king of Jerusalem heard that Joshua had taken Ai and totally destroyed it, doing to Ai and its king as he had done to Jericho and its king, and that the people of Gibeon had made a treaty of **peace** with Israel and were living near them.
- Jsh. 10:4** “Come up and help me attack Gibeon,” he said, “because it has made **peace** with Joshua and the Israelites.”
- Jsh. 11:19** Except for the Hivites living in Gibeon, not one city made a treaty of **peace** with the Israelites, who took them all in battle.
- Jdg. 3:11** So the land had **peace** for forty years, until Othniel son of Kenaz died.
- Jdg. 3:30** That day Moab was made subject to Israel, and the land had **peace** for eighty years.
- Jdg. 5:31** “So may all your enemies perish, O LORD!  
But may they who love you be like the sun  
when it rises in its strength.”  
Then the land had **peace** forty years.
- Jdg. 6:23** But the LORD said to him, “**Peace!** Do not be afraid. You are not going to die.”

- Jdg. 6:24** So Gideon built an altar to the LORD there and called it The LORD is **Peace**. To this day it stands in Ophrah of the Abiezrites.
- Jdg. 8:28** Thus Midian was subdued before the Israelites and did not raise its head again. During Gideon's lifetime, the land enjoyed **peace** forty years.
- Jdg. 11:13** The king of the Ammonites answered Jephthah's messengers, "When Israel came up out of Egypt, they took away my land from the Arnon to the Jabbok, all the way to the Jordan. Now give it back **peaceably**."
- Jdg. 18:6** The priest answered them, "Go in **peace**. Your journey has the LORD's approval."
- Jdg. 18:27** Then they took what Micah had made, and his priest, and went on to Laish, against a **peaceful** and unsuspecting people. They attacked them with the sword and burned down their city.
- Jdg. 21:13** Then the whole assembly sent an offer of **peace** to the Benjamites at the rock of Rimmon.
- 1Sam. 1:17** Eli answered, "Go in **peace**, and may the God of Israel grant you what you have asked of him."
- 1Sam. 7:14** The towns from Ekron to Gath that the Philistines had captured from Israel were restored to her, and Israel delivered the neighboring territory from the power of the Philistines. And there was **peace** between Israel and the Amorites.
- 1Sam. 16:4** Samuel did what the LORD said. When he arrived at Bethlehem, the elders of the town trembled when they met him. They asked, "Do you come in **peace**?"
- 1Sam. 16:5** Samuel replied, "Yes, in **peace**; I have come to sacrifice to the LORD. Consecrate yourselves and come to the sacrifice with me." Then he consecrated Jesse and his sons and invited them to the sacrifice.
- 1Sam. 20:42** Jonathan said to David, "Go in **peace**, for we have sworn friendship with each other in the name of the LORD, saying, 'The LORD is witness between you and me, and between your descendants and my descendants forever.'" Then David left, and Jonathan went back to the town.
- 1Sam. 25:35** Then David accepted from her hand what she had brought him and said, "Go home in **peace**. I have heard your words and granted your request."
- 1Sam. 29:7** Turn back and go in **peace**; do nothing to displease the Philistine rulers."
- 2Sam. 3:21** Then Abner said to David, "Let me go at once and assemble all Israel for my lord the king, so that they may make a compact with you, and that you may rule over all that your heart desires." So David sent Abner away, and he went in **peace**.
- 2Sam. 3:22-23** Just then David's men and Joab returned from a raid and brought with them a great deal of plunder. But Abner was no longer with David in Hebron, because David had sent him away, and he had gone in **peace**. When Joab and all the soldiers with him arrived, he was told that Abner son of Ner had come to the king and that the king had sent him away and that he had gone in **peace**.

- 2Sam. 10:19** When all the kings who were vassals of Hadadezer saw that they had been defeated by Israel, they made **peace** with the Israelites and became subject to them.  
So the Arameans were afraid to help the Ammonites anymore.
- 2Sam. 15:9** The king said to him, “Go in **peace**.” So he went to Hebron.
- 2Sam. 15:27** The king also said to Zadok the priest, “Aren’t you a seer? Go back to the city in **peace**, with your son Ahimaaz and Jonathan son of Abiathar. You and Abiathar take your two sons with you.
- 2Sam. 20:19** We are the **peaceful** and faithful in Israel. You are trying to destroy a city that is a mother in Israel. Why do you want to swallow up the LORD’s inheritance?”
- 1Ki. 2:5-6** “Now you yourself know what Joab son of Zeruah did to me – what he did to the two commanders of Israel’s armies, Abner son of Ner and Amasa son of Jether. He killed them, shedding their blood in **peacetime** as if in battle, and with that blood stained the belt around his waist and the sandals on his feet. Deal with him according to your wisdom, but do not let his gray head go down to the grave in **peace**.”
- 1Ki. 2:13** Now Adonijah, the son of Haggith, went to Bathsheba, Solomon’s mother. Bathsheba asked him, “Do you come **peacefully**?”  
He answered, “Yes, **peacefully**.”
- 1Ki. 2:33** May the guilt of their blood rest on the head of Joab and his descendants forever. But on David and his descendants, his house and his throne, may there be the LORD’s **peace** forever.”
- 1Ki. 4:24** For he ruled over all the kingdoms west of the River, from Tiphshah to Gaza, and had **peace** on all sides.
- 1Ki. 5:12** The LORD gave Solomon wisdom, just as he had promised him. There were **peaceful** relations between Hiram and Solomon, and the two of them made a treaty.
- 1Ki. 20:18** He said, “If they have come out for **peace**, take them alive; if they have come out for war, take them alive.”
- 1Ki. 22:17** Then Micaiah answered, “I saw all Israel scattered on the hills like sheep without a shepherd, and the LORD said, ‘These people have no master. Let each one go home in **peace**.’”
- 1Ki. 22:44** Jehoshaphat was also at **peace** with the king of Israel.
- 2Ki. 5:19** “Go in **peace**,” Elisha said. After Naaman had traveled some distance,
- 2Ki. 9:17-19** When the lookout standing on the tower in Jezreel saw Jehu’s troops approaching, he called out, “I see some troops coming.”  
“Get a horseman,” Joram ordered. “Send him to meet them and ask, ‘Do you come in **peace**?’”  
The horseman rode off to meet Jehu and said, “This is what the king says: ‘Do you come in **peace**?’”  
“What do you have to do with **peace**?” Jehu replied. “Fall in behind me.”  
The lookout reported, “The messenger has reached them, but he isn’t coming back.”  
So the king sent out a second horseman. When he came to them he said, “This is what the king says: ‘Do you come in **peace**?’”

Jehu replied, "What do you have to do with **peace**? Fall in behind me."

**2Ki. 9:22** When Joram saw Jehu he asked, "Have you come in **peace**, Jehu?"  
"How can there be **peace**," Jehu replied, "as long as all the idolatry and witchcraft of your mother Jezebel abound?"

**2Ki. 9:31** As Jehu entered the gate, she asked, "Have you come in **peace**, Zimri, you murderer of your master?"

**2Ki. 18:31** "Do not listen to Hezekiah. This is what the king of Assyria says: Make **peace** with me and come out to me. Then every one of you will eat from his own vine and fig tree and drink water from his own cistern,

**2Ki. 20:19** "The word of the LORD you have spoken is good," Hezekiah replied. For he thought, "Will there not be **peace** and security in my lifetime?"

**2Ki. 22:20** Therefore I will gather you to your fathers, and you will be buried in **peace**. Your eyes will not see all the disaster I am going to bring on this place."  
So they took her answer back to the king.

**1Chr. 4:40** They found rich, good pasture, and the land was spacious, **peaceful** and quiet. Some Hamites had lived there formerly.

**1Chr. 12:17** David went out to meet them and said to them, "If you have come to me in **peace**, to help me, I am ready to have you unite with me. But if you have come to betray me to my enemies when my hands are free from violence, may the God of our fathers see it and judge you."

**Jer. 6:14** They dress the wound of my people

‘**Peace, peace**,’ they say,

**Jer. 8:11** They dress the wound of my people

**Jer. 8:15** We hoped for **peace**

**Jer. 25:37** The **peaceful** meadows will be laid waste  
because of the fierce anger of the LORD.

**Jer. 28:9** But the prophet who prophesies **peace** will be recognized as one truly sent by the LORD  
only if his prediction comes true.”

**Jer. 29:7** Also, seek the **peace** and prosperity of the city to which I have carried you into exile. Pray  
to the LORD for it, because if it prospers, you too will prosper.”

**Jer. 30:5** “This is what the LORD says:  
“ ‘Cries of fear are heard – terror, not **peace**.

**Jer. 30:10** “ ‘So do not fear, O Jacob my servant;  
do not be dismayed, O Israel,’ declares the LORD.

**Ez. 13:16** those prophets of Israel who prophesied to Jerusalem and saw visions of **peace** for her when there was no **peace**, declares the Sovereign LORD.” ’

**Ez. 34:25** “ ‘I will make a covenant of **peace** with them and rid the land of wild beasts so that they may live in the desert and sleep in the forests in safety.

**Ez. 37:26** I will make a covenant of **peace** with them; it will be an everlasting covenant. I will establish them and increase their numbers, and I will put my sanctuary among them forever.

**Ez. 38:11** You will say, “I will invade a land of unwalled villages; I will attack a **peaceful** and unsuspecting people – all of them living without walls and without gates and bars.

**Dan. 10:19** “Do not be afraid, O man highly esteemed,” he said. “**Peace!** Be strong now; be strong.” When he spoke to me, I was strengthened and said, “Speak, my lord, since you have given me strength.”

**Mic. 3:5** This is what the LORD says:  
“As for the prophets  
who lead my people astray,  
if one feeds them,

- Jn. 14:27 **Peace** I leave with you; my **peace** I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid.
- Jn. 16:33 “I have told you these things, so that in me you may have **peace**. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world.”
- Jn. 20:19 On the evening of that first day of the week, when the disciples were together, with the doors locked for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, “**Peace** be with you!”
- Jn. 20:21 Again Jesus said, “**Peace** be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you.”
- Jn. 20:26 A week later his disciples were in the house again, and Thomas was with them. Though the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, “**Peace** be with you!”
- Ac. 9:31 Then the church throughout Judea, Galilee and Samaria enjoyed a time of **peace**. It was strengthened; and encouraged by the Holy Spirit, it grew in numbers, living in the fear of the Lord.
- Ac. 10:36 You know the message God sent to the people of Israel, telling the good news of **peace** through Jesus Christ, who is Lord of all.

- Ac. 12:20** He had been quarreling with the people of Tyre and Sidon; they now joined together and sought an audience with him. Having secured the support of Blastus, a trusted personal servant of the king, they asked for **peace**, because they depended on the king's country for their food supply.
- Ac. 15:33** After spending some time there, they were sent off by the brothers with the blessing of **peace** to return to those who had sent them.
- Ac. 16:36** The jailer told Paul, "The magistrates have ordered that you and Silas be released. Now you can leave. Go in **peace**."
- Ac. 24:2** When Paul was called in, Tertullus presented his case before Felix: "We have enjoyed a long period of **peace** under you, and your foresight has brought about reforms in this nation.
- Ro. 1:7** To all in Rome who are loved by God and called to be saints:  
Grace and **peace** to you from God our Father and from the Lord Jesus Christ.
- Ro. 2:10** but glory, honor and **peace** for everyone who does good: first for the Jew, then for the Gentile.
- Ro. 3:17** and the way of **peace** they do not know."
- Ro. 5:1** Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have **peace** with God through our Lord Jesus Christ,
- Ro. 8:6** The mind of sinful man is death, but the mind controlled by the Spirit is life and **peace**;
- Ro. 12:18** If it is possible, as far as it depends on you, live at **peace** with everyone.
- Ro. 14:17** For the kingdom of God is not a matter of eating and drinking, but of righteousness, **peace** and joy in the Holy Spirit,
- Ro. 14:19** Let us therefore make every effort to do what leads to **peace** and to mutual edification.
- Ro. 15:13** May the God of hope fill you with all joy and **peace** as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.
- Ro. 15:33** The God of **peace** be with you all. Amen.
- Ro. 16:20** The God of **peace** will soon crush Satan under your feet.  
The grace of our Lord Jesus be with you.
- 1Co. 1:3** Grace and **peace** to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.
- 1Co. 7:15** But if the unbeliever leaves, let him do so. A believing man or woman is not bound in such circumstances; God has called us to live in **peace**.
- 1Co. 14:33** For God is not a God of disorder but of **peace**.

- Eph. 4:3** Make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of **peace**.
- Eph. 6:15** and with your feet fitted with the readiness that comes from the gospel of **peace**.
- Eph. 6:23** **Peace** to the brothers, and love with faith from God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.
- Pp. 1:2** Grace and **peace** to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.
- Pp. 4:7** And the **peace** of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.
- Pp. 4:9** Whatever you have learned or received or heard from me, or seen in me – put it into practice. And the God of **peace** will be with you.
- Col. 1:2** To the holy and faithful brothers in Christ at Colosse:  
Grace and **peace** to you from God our Father.
- Col. 1:20** and through him to reconcile to himself all things, whether things on earth or things in heaven, by making **peace** through his blood, shed on the cross.
- Col. 3:15** Let the **peace** of Christ rule in your hearts, since as members of one body you were called to **peace**. And be thankful.
- 1Th. 1:1** Paul, Silas and Timothy,  
To the church of the Thessalonians in God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ:  
Grace and **peace** to you.
- 1Th. 5:3** While people are saying, “**Peace** and safety,” destruction will come on them suddenly, as labor pains on a pregnant woman, and they will not escape.

- 1Th. 5:13** Hold them in the highest regard in love because of their work. Live in **peace** with each other.
- 1Th. 5:23** May God himself, the God of **peace**, sanctify you through and through. May your whole spirit, soul and body be kept blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.
- 2Th. 1:2** Grace and **peace** to you from God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.
- 2Th. 3:16** Now may the Lord of **peace** himself give you **peace** at all times and in every way. The Lord be with all of you.
- 1Tim. 1:2** To Timothy my true son in the faith:  
Grace, mercy and **peace** from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord.

- 1Pt. 1:2** who have been chosen according to the foreknowledge of God the Father, through the sanctifying work of the Spirit, for obedience to Jesus Christ and sprinkling by his blood:  
Grace and **peace** be yours in abundance.

- 1Pt. 3:11** He must turn from evil and do good;  
he must seek **peace** and pursue it.
- 1Pt. 5:14** Greet one another with a kiss of love.  
**Peace** to all of you who are in Christ.
- 2Pt. 1:2** Grace and **peace** be yours in abundance through the knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord.
- 2Pt. 3:14** So then, dear friends, since you are looking forward to this, make every effort to be found spotless, blameless and at **peace** with him.
- 2Jn. 3** Grace, mercy and **peace** from God the Father and from Jesus Christ, the Father's Son, will be with us in truth and love.
- 3Jn. 14** I hope to see you soon, and we will talk face to face.

- Jde 2** Mercy, **peace** and love be yours in abundance.

To the seven churches in the province of Asia:  
Grace and **peace** to you from him who is, and who was, and who is to come, and from the seven spirits before his throne,
