- Gen. 43:31 After he had washed his face, he came out and, **control**ling him**self**, said, "Serve the food."
- Gen. 45:1 Then Joseph could no longer **control** him**self** before all his attendants, and he cried out, "Have everyone leave my presence!" So there was no one with Joseph when he made himself known to his brothers.
- Pr. 25:28 Like a city whose walls are broken down is a man who lacks **self-control**.
- Pr. 29:11 A fool gives full vent to his anger, but a wise man keeps him**self** under **control**.
