- 1Ki. 8:47 and if they have a change of heart in the land where they are held captive, and **repent** and plead with you in the land of their conquerors and say, 'We have sinned, we have done wrong, we have acted wickedly';
- 2Chr. 6:37 and if they have a change of heart in the land where they are held captive, and repent and plead with you in the land of their captivity and say, 'We have sinned, we have done wrong and acted wickedly';
- 2Chr. 32:26 Then Hezekiah **repented** of the pride of his heart, as did the people of Jerusalem; therefore the LORD's wrath did not come upon them during the days of Hezekiah.
- Job 34:33 Should God then reward you on your terms, when you refuse to **repent**?

 You must decide, not I;
 so tell me what you know.
- Job 36:10 He makes them listen to correction and commands them to **repent** of their evil.

- Jer. 34:15 Recently you **repented** and did what is right in my sight: Each of you proclaimed freedom to his countrymen. You even made a covenant before me in the house that bears my Name.
- Ez. 14:6 "Therefore say to the house of Israel, 'This is what the Sovereign Lord says: Repent! Turn from your idols and renounce all your detestable practices!
- Ez. 18:30 "Therefore, O house of Israel, I will judge you, each one according to his ways, declares the Sovereign LORD. Repent! Turn away from all your offenses; then sin will not be your downfall.
- Ez. 18:32 For I take no pleasure in the death of anyone, declares the Sovereign LORD. Repent and live!

- Mt. 4:17 From that time on Jesus began to preach, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is near."

- Mt. 11:20-21 Then Jesus began to denounce the cities in which most of his miracles had been performed, because they did not **repent**. "Woe to you, Korazin! Woe to you, Bethsaida! If the miracles that were performed in you had been performed in Tyre and Sidon, they would have **repented** long ago in sackcloth and ashes.
- Mt. 12:41 The men of Nineveh will stand up at the judgment with this generation and condemn it; for they **repented** at the preaching of Jonah, and now one greater than Jonah is here.
- Mt. 21:32 For John came to you to show you the way of righteousness, and you did not believe him, but the tax collectors and the prostitutes did. And even after you saw this, you did not **repent** and believe him.
- Mk. 1:4 And so John came, baptizing in the desert region and preaching a baptism of **repentance** for the forgiveness of sins.
- Mk. 1:15 "The time has come," he said. "The kingdom of God is near. **Repent** and believe the good news!"
- Mk. 6:12 They went out and preached that people should **repent**.
- Lk. 3:3 He went into all the country around the Jordan, preaching a baptism of **repentance** for the forgiveness of sins.
- Lk. 3:8 Produce fruit in keeping with **repentance**. And do not begin to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father.' For I tell you that out of these stones God can raise up children for Abraham.
- Lk. 5:32 I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners to **repentance**."

- Lk. 24:47 and **repentance** and forgiveness of sins will be preached in his name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem.
- Ac. 2:38 Peter replied, "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins. And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.
- Ac. 3:19 Repent, then, and turn to God, so that your sins may be wiped out, that times of refreshing may come from the Lord,
- Ac. 5:31 God exalted him to his own right hand as Prince and Savior that he might give **repentance** and forgiveness of sins to Israel.
- Ac. 8:22 Repent of this wickedness and pray to the Lord. Perhaps he will forgive you for having such a thought in your heart.
- Ac. 11:18 When they heard this, they had no further objections and praised God, saying, "So then, God has granted even the Gentiles **repentance** unto life."
- Ac. 13:24 Before the coming of Jesus, John preached **repentance** and baptism to all the people of Israel.

- Ac. 26:20 First to those in Damascus, then to those in Jerusalem and in all Judea, and to the Gentiles also, I preached that they should **repent** and turn to God and prove their **repentance** by their deeds.
- Ro. 2:4 Or do you show contempt for the riches of his kindness, tolerance and patience, not realizing that God's kindness leads you toward **repentance**?
- 2Co. 7:9-10 yet now I am happy, not because you were made sorry, but because your sorrow led you to repentance. For you became sorrowful as God intended and so were not harmed in any way by us. Godly sorrow brings repentance that leads to salvation and leaves no regret, but worldly sorrow brings death.
- 2Co. 12:21 I am afraid that when I come again my God will humble me before you, and I will be grieved over many who have sinned earlier and have not repented of the impurity, sexual sin and debauchery in which they have indulged.
- 2Ti. 2:25 Those who oppose him he must gently instruct, in the hope that God will grant them repentance leading them to a knowledge of the truth,
- Heb. 6:1 Therefore let us leave the elementary teachings about Christ and go on to maturity, not laying again the foundation of **repentance** from acts that lead to death, and of faith in God,

- Heb. 6:6 if they fall away, to be brought back to **repentance**, because to their loss they are crucifying the Son of God all over again and subjecting him to public disgrace.
- **2Pt. 3:9** The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. He is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to **repentance**.
- Rev. 2:5 Remember the height from which you have fallen! **Repent** and do the things you did at first. If you do not **repent**, I will come to you and remove your lampstand from its place.
- Rev. 2:16 Repent therefore! Otherwise, I will soon come to you and will fight against them with the sword of my mouth.
- Rev. 2:21-22 I have given her time to **repent** of her immorality, but she is unwilling. So I will cast her on a bed of suffering, and I will make those who commit adultery with her suffer intensely, unless they **repent** of her ways.
- Rev. 3:3 Remember, therefore, what you have received and heard; obey it, and **repent**. But if you do not wake up, I will come like a thief, and you will not know at what time I will come to you.
- Rev. 3:19 Those whom I love I rebuke and discipline. So be earnest, and **repent**.
- Rev. 9:20-21 The rest of mankind that were not killed by these plagues still did not **repent** of the work of their hands; they did not stop worshiping demons, and idols of gold, silver, bronze, stone and wood idols that cannot see or hear or walk. Nor did they **repent** of their murders, their magic arts, their sexual immorality or their thefts.
- Rev. 16:9 They were seared by the intense heat and they cursed the name of God, who had control over these plagues, but they refused to **repent** and glorify him.
- Rev. 16:11 and cursed the God of heaven because of their pains and their sores, but they refused to repent of what they had done.
