

## **forgive / forgave / forgiven / forgiveness / forgives / forgiving (150)**

- Gen. 50:17** ‘This is what you are to say to Joseph: I ask you to **forgive** your brothers the sins and the wrongs they committed in treating you so badly.’ Now please **forgive** the sins of the servants of the God of your father.” When their message came to him, Joseph wept.
- Ex. 10:17** Now **forgive** my sin once more and pray to the LORD your God to take this deadly plague away from me.”
- Ex. 23:21** Pay attention to him and listen to what he says. Do not rebel against him; he will not **forgive** your rebellion, since my Name is in him.
- Ex. 32:32** But now, please **forgive** their sin – but if not, then blot me out of the book you have written.”
- Ex. 34:7** maintaining love to thousands, and **forgiving** wickedness, rebellion and sin. Yet he does not leave the guilty unpunished; he punishes the children and their children for the sin of the fathers to the third and fourth generation.”
- Ex. 34:9** “O Lord, if I have found favor in your eyes,” he said, “then let the Lord go with us. Although this is a stiff-necked people, **forgive** our wickedness and our sin, and take us as your inheritance.”
- Lev. 4:20** and do with this bull just as he did with the bull for the sin offering. In this way the priest will make atonement for them, and they will be **forgiven**.
- Lev. 4:26** He shall burn all the fat on the altar as he burned the fat of the fellowship offering. In this way the priest will make atonement for the man’s sin, and he will be **forgiven**.
- Lev. 4:31** He shall remove all the fat, just as the fat is removed from the fellowship offering, and the priest shall burn it on the altar as an aroma pleasing to the LORD. In this way the priest will make atonement for him, and he will be **forgiven**.
- Lev. 4:35** He shall remove all the fat, just as the fat is removed from the lamb of the fellowship offering, and the priest shall burn it on the altar on top of the offerings made to the LORD by fire. In this way the priest will make atonement for him for the sin he has committed, and he will be **forgiven**.
- Lev. 5:10** The priest shall then offer the other as a burnt offering in the prescribed way and make atonement for him for the sin he has committed, and he will be **forgiven**.
- Lev. 5:13** In this way the priest will make atonement for him for any of these sins he has committed, and he will be **forgiven**. The rest of the offering will belong to the priest, as in the case of the grain offering.”
- Lev. 5:16** He must make restitution for what he has failed to do in regard to the holy things, add a fifth of the value to that and give it all to the priest, who will make atonement for him with the ram as a guilt offering, and he will be **forgiven**.

**Lev. 5:18** He is to bring to the priest as a guilt offering a ram from the flock, one without defect and of the proper value. In this way the priest will make atonement for him for the wrong he has committed unintentionally, and he will be **forgiven**.

**Lev. 6:7** In this way the priest will make atonement for him before the LORD, and he will be **forgiven** for any of these things he did that made him guilty.”

**Lev. 19:22** With the ram of the guilt offering the priest is to make atonement for him before the LORD for the sin he has committed, and his sin will be **forgiven**.

**Num. 14:18-19** ‘The LORD is slow to anger, abounding in love and **forgiving** sin and rebellion. Yet he does not leave the guilty unpunished; he punishes the children for the sin of the fathers to the third and fourth generation.’ In accordance with your great love, **forgive** the sin of these people, just as you have pardoned them from the time they left Egypt until now.”

**Num. 14:20** The LORD replied, “I have **forgiven** them, as you asked.

**Num. 15:25-26** The priest is to make atonement for the whole Israelite community, and they will be **forgiven**, for it was not intentional and they have brought to the LORD for their wrong an offering made by fire and a sin offering. The whole Israelite community and the aliens living among them will be **forgiven**, because all the people were involved in the unintentional wrong.

**Num. 15:28** The priest is to make atonement before the LORD for the one who erred by sinning unintentionally, and when atonement has been made for him, he will be **forgiven**.

**Dt. 29:20** The LORD will never be willing to **forgive** him; his wrath and zeal will burn against that man. All the curses written in this book will fall upon him, and the LORD will blot out his name from under heaven.

**Jsh. 24:19** Joshua said to the people, “You are not able to serve the LORD. He is a holy God; he is a jealous God. He will not **forgive** your rebellion and your sins.

**1Sam. 15:25** Now I beg you, **forgive** my sin and come back with me, so that I may worship the LORD.”

**1Sam. 25:28** Please **forgive** your servant’s offense, for the LORD will certainly make a lasting dynasty for my master, because he fights the LORD’s battles. Let no wrongdoing be found in you as long as you live.

**1Ki. 8:30** Hear the supplication of your servant and of your people Israel when they pray toward this place. Hear from heaven, your dwelling place, and when you hear, **forgive**.

**1Ki. 8:34** then hear from heaven and **forgive** the sin of your people Israel and bring them back to the land you gave to their fathers.

**1Ki. 8:36** then hear from heaven and **forgive** the sin of your servants, your people Israel. Teach them the right way to live, and send rain on the land you gave your people for an inheritance.

**1Ki. 8:39** then hear from heaven, your dwelling place. **Forgive** and act; deal with each man according to all he does, since you know his heart (for you alone know the hearts of all men),

**1Ki. 8:50** And **forgive** your people, who have sinned against you; **forgive** all the offenses they have committed against you, and cause their conquerors to show them mercy;

**2Ki. 5:18** But may the LORD **forgive** your servant for this one thing: When my master enters the temple of Rimmon to bow down and he is leaning on my arm and I bow there also – when I bow down in the temple of Rimmon, may the LORD **forgive** your servant for this.”

**2Ki. 24:4** including the shedding of innocent blood. For he had filled Jerusalem with innocent blood, and the LORD was not willing to **forgive**.

**2Chr. 6:21** Hear the supplications of your servant and of your people Israel when they pray toward this place. Hear from heaven, your dwelling place; and when you hear, **forgive**.

**2Chr. 6:25** then hear from heaven and **forgive** the sin of your people Israel and bring them back to the land you gave to them and their fathers.

**2Chr. 6:27** then hear from heaven and **forgive** the sin of your servants, your people Israel. Teach them the right way to live, and send rain on the land you gave your people for an inheritance.

**2Chr. 6:30** then hear from heaven, your dwelling place. **Forgive**, and deal with each man according to all he does, since you know his heart (for you alone know the hearts of men),

**2Chr. 6:39** then from heaven, your dwelling place, hear their prayer and their pleas, and uphold their cause. And **forgive** your people, who have sinned against you.

**2Chr. 7:14** if my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then will I hear from heaven and will **forgive** their sin and will heal their land.

**Neh. 9:17** They refused to listen and failed to remember the miracles you performed among them. They became stiff-necked and in their rebellion appointed a leader in order to return to their slavery. But you are a **forgiving** God, gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and abounding in love. Therefore you did not desert them,

**Job 7:21** Why do you not pardon my offenses  
and **forgive** my sins?  
For I will soon lie down in the dust;  
you will search for me, but I will be no more.”

**Ps. 19:12** Who can discern his errors?  
**Forgive** my hidden faults.

- Ps. 25:11** For the sake of your name, O LORD,  
**forgive** my iniquity, though it is great.
- Ps. 32:1** Blessed is he  
whose transgressions are **forgiven**,  
whose sins are covered.
- Ps. 32:5** Then I acknowledged my sin to you  
and did not cover up my iniquity.  
I said, "I will confess  
my transgressions to the LORD" –  
and you **forgave**  
the guilt of my sin. *Selah*
- Ps. 65:3** When we were overwhelmed by sins,  
you **forgave** our transgressions.
- Ps. 78:38** Yet he was merciful;  
he **forgave** their iniquities  
and did not destroy them.  
Time after time he restrained his anger  
and did not stir up his full wrath.
- Ps. 79:9** Help us, O God our Savior,  
for the glory of your name;  
deliver us and **forgive** our sins  
for your name's sake.
- Ps. 85:2** You **forgave** the iniquity of your people  
and covered all their sins. *Selah*
- Ps. 86:5** You are **forgiving** and good, O Lord,  
abounding in love to all who call to you.
- Ps. 99:8** O LORD our God,  
you answered them;  
you were to Israel a **forgiving** God,  
though you punished their misdeeds.
- Ps. 103:3** who **forgives** all your sins  
and heals all your diseases,
- Ps. 130:4** But with you there is **forgiveness**;  
therefore you are feared.
- Is. 2:9** So man will be brought low  
and mankind humbled –  
do not **forgive** them.
- Is. 33:24** No one living in Zion will say, "I am ill";  
and the sins of those who dwell there will be **forgiven**.

- Jer. 5:1** “Go up and down the streets of Jerusalem,  
look around and consider,  
search through her squares.  
If you can find but one person  
who deals honestly and seeks the truth,  
I will **forgive** this city.
- Jer. 5:7** “Why should I **forgive** you?  
Your children have forsaken me  
and sworn by gods that are not gods.  
I supplied all their needs,  
yet they committed adultery  
and thronged to the houses of prostitutes.
- Jer. 18:23** But you know, O LORD,  
all their plots to kill me.  
Do not **forgive** their crimes  
or blot out their sins from your sight.  
Let them be overthrown before you;  
deal with them in the time of your anger.
- Jer. 31:34** No longer will a man teach his neighbor,  
or a man his brother, saying, ‘Know the LORD,’  
because they will all know me,  
from the least of them to the greatest,” declares the LORD.  
“For I will **forgive** their wickedness  
and will remember their sins no more.”
- Jer. 33:8** I will cleanse them from all the sin they have committed against me and will  
**forgive** all their sins of rebellion against me.
- Jer. 36:3** Perhaps when the people of Judah hear about every disaster I plan to inflict  
on them, each of them will turn from his wicked way; then I will **forgive** their  
wickedness and their sin.”
- Jer. 50:20** In those days, at that time,”  
declares the LORD,  
“search will be made for Israel’s guilt,  
but there will be none,  
and for the sins of Judah,  
but none will be found,  
for I will **forgive** the remnant I spare.
- Lam. 3:42** “We have sinned and rebelled  
and you have not **forgiven**.
- Dan. 9:9** The Lord our God is merciful and **forgiving**, even though we have rebelled  
against him;
- Dan. 9:19** O Lord, listen! O Lord, **forgive!** O Lord, hear and act! For your sake, O my  
God, do not delay, because your city and your people bear your Name.”

- Hos. 1:6** Gomer conceived again and gave birth to a daughter. Then the LORD said to Hosea, “Call her Lo-Ruhamah, for I will no longer show love to the house of Israel, that I should at all **forgive** them.
- Hos. 14:2** Take words with you  
and return to the LORD.  
Say to him:  
“**Forgive** all our sins  
and receive us graciously,  
that we may offer the fruit of our lips.
- Am. 7:2** When they had stripped the land clean, I cried out, “Sovereign LORD, **forgive!**  
How can Jacob survive? He is so small!”
- Mic. 7:18** Who is a God like you,  
who pardons sin and **forgives** the transgression  
of the remnant of his inheritance?  
You do not stay angry forever  
but delight to show mercy.
- Mt. 6:12** **Forgive** us our debts,  
as we also have **forgiven** our debtors.
- Mt. 6:14-15** For if you **forgive** men when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also **forgive** you. But if you do not **forgive** men their sins, your Father will not **forgive** your sins.
- Mt. 9:2** Some men brought to him a paralytic, lying on a mat. When Jesus saw their faith, he said to the paralytic, “**Take heart, son; your sins are forgiven.**”
- Mt. 9:5-6** Which is easier: to say, ‘Your sins are **forgiven,**’ or to say, ‘Get up and walk’? But so that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to **forgive** sins. . . .” Then he said to the paralytic, “Get up, take your mat and go home.”
- Mt. 12:31-32** And so I tell you, every sin and blasphemy will be **forgiven** men, but the blasphemy against the Spirit will not be **forgiven**. Anyone who speaks a word against the Son of Man will be **forgiven**, but anyone who speaks against the Holy Spirit will not be **forgiven**, either in this age or in the age to come.
- Mt. 18:21** Then Peter came to Jesus and asked, “Lord, how many times shall I **forgive** my brother when he sins against me? Up to seven times?”
- Mt. 18:35** “This is how my heavenly Father will treat each of you unless you **forgive** your brother from your heart.”
- Mt. 26:28** This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the **forgiveness** of sins.
- Mk. 1:4** And so John came, baptizing in the desert region and preaching a baptism of repentance for the **forgiveness** of sins.

- Mk. 2:5** When Jesus saw their faith, he said to the paralytic, “**Son, your sins are forgiven.**”
- Mk. 2:7** “Why does this fellow talk like that? He’s blaspheming! Who can **forgive** sins but God alone?”
- Mk. 2:9-10** Which is easier: to say to the paralytic, ‘Your sins are **forgiven,**’ or to say, ‘Get up, take your mat and walk’? But that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to **forgive** sins . . . .” He said to the paralytic,
- Mk. 3:28-29** I tell you the truth, all the sins and blasphemies of men will be **forgiven** them. But whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit will never be **forgiven**; he is guilty of an eternal sin.”
- Mk. 4:12** so that,  
“ they may be ever seeing but never perceiving,  
and ever hearing but never understanding;  
otherwise they might turn and be **forgiven!**”
- Mk. 11:25** And when you stand praying, if you hold anything against anyone, **forgive** him, so that your Father in heaven may **forgive** you your sins.”
- Lk. 1:77** to give his people the knowledge of salvation  
through the **forgiveness** of their sins,
- Lk. 3:3** He went into all the country around the Jordan, preaching a baptism of repentance for the **forgiveness** of sins.
- Lk. 5:20** When Jesus saw their faith, he said, “**Friend, your sins are forgiven.**”
- Lk. 5:21** The Pharisees and the teachers of the law began thinking to themselves, “Who is this fellow who speaks blasphemy? Who can **forgive** sins but God alone?”
- Lk. 5:23** Which is easier: to say, ‘Your sins are **forgiven,**’ or to say, ‘Get up and walk’? But that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to **forgive** sins. . . .” He said to the paralyzed man, “I tell you, get up, take your mat and go home.”
- Lk. 6:37** “Do not judge, and you will not be judged. Do not condemn, and you will not be condemned. **Forgive,** and you will be **forgiven.**”
- Lk. 7:47** Therefore, I tell you, her many sins have been **forgiven** – for she loved much. But he who has been **forgiven** little loves little.”
- Lk. 7:48** Then Jesus said to her, “**Your sins are forgiven.**”
- Lk. 7:49** The other guests began to say among themselves, “Who is this who even **forgives** sins?”
- Lk. 11:4** **Forgive** us our sins,  
for we also **forgive** everyone who sins against us.  
And lead us not into temptation.”



- Lk. 12:10** And everyone who speaks a word against the Son of Man will be **forgiven**, but anyone who blasphemes against the Holy Spirit will not be **forgiven**.
- Lk. 17:3-4** So watch yourselves.  
“If your brother sins, rebuke him, and if he repents, **forgive** him. If he sins against you seven times in a day, and seven times comes back to you and says, ‘I repent,’ **forgive** him.”
- Lk. 23:34** Jesus said, “Father, **forgive** them, for they do not know what they are doing.” And they divided up his clothes by casting lots.
- Lk. 24:47** and repentance and **forgiveness** of sins will be preached in his name to all nations, beginning at Jerusalem.
- Jn. 20:23** If you **forgive** anyone his sins, they are **forgiven**; if you do not **forgive** them, they are not **forgiven**.”
- Ac. 2:38** Peter replied, “Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the **forgiveness** of your sins. And you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit.
- Ac. 5:31** God exalted him to his own right hand as Prince and Savior that he might give repentance and **forgiveness** of sins to Israel.
- Ac. 8:22** Repent of this wickedness and pray to the Lord. Perhaps he will **forgive** you for having such a thought in your heart.
- Ac. 10:43** All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives **forgiveness** of sins through his name.”
- Ac. 13:38** “Therefore, my brothers, I want you to know that through Jesus the **forgiveness** of sins is proclaimed to you.
- Ac. 26:18** to open their eyes and turn them from darkness to light, and from the power of Satan to God, so that they may receive **forgiveness** of sins and a place among those who are sanctified by faith in me.’
- Ro. 4:7** “Blessed are they  
whose transgressions are **forgiven**,  
whose sins are covered.
- 2Co. 2:7** Now instead, you ought to **forgive** and comfort him, so that he will not be overwhelmed by excessive sorrow.
- 2Co. 2:10** If you **forgive** anyone, I also **forgive** him. And what I have **forgiven** – if there was anything to **forgive** – I have **forgiven** in the sight of Christ for your sake,
- 2Co. 12:13** How were you inferior to the other churches, except that I was never a burden to you? **Forgive** me this wrong!
- Eph. 1:7** In him we have redemption through his blood, the **forgiveness** of sins, in accordance with the riches of God’s grace



**Eph. 4:32** Be kind and compassionate to one another, **forgiving** each other, just as in Christ God **forgave** you.

**Col. 1:14** in whom we have redemption, the **forgiveness** of sins.

**Col. 2:13** When you were dead in your sins and in the uncircumcision of your sinful nature, God made you alive with Christ. He **forgave** us all our sins,

**Col. 3:13** Bear with each other and **forgive** whatever grievances you may have against one another. **Forgive** as the Lord **forgave** you.

**Heb. 8:12** For I will **forgive** their wickedness  
and will remember their sins no more.”

**Heb. 9:22** In fact, the law requires that nearly everything be cleansed with blood, and without the shedding of blood there is no **forgiveness**.

**Heb. 10:18** And where these have been **forgiven**, there is no longer any sacrifice for sin.

**Jas. 5:15** And the prayer offered in faith will make the sick person well; the Lord will raise him up. If he has sinned, he will be **forgiven**.

**1Jn. 1:9** If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will **forgive** us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.

**1Jn. 2:12** I write to you, dear children,  
because your sins have been **forgiven** on account of his name.
